Greetings Friends and Supporters:

It has been almost six years since the completion of the Capitol Drive Streetscape improvements by the Riverworks Business Improvement District 25 (BID) & the City of Milwaukee. The streetscape work has held up fairly well. Over the next two years, the BID will be upgrading and removing items to improve the aesthetics along Capitol Drive, with the goal of keeping the commercial strip a vibrant business district where companies and retailers want to locate and where people want to shop and eat.

We will be expanding the branding of the Riverworks Center from an industrial park to a thriving mixed-use district that supports an innovative mix of industry, technology and retail. We are encouraging projects in the area to use green building techniques and Leadership in Energy and Environment Design (LEED) guidelines to improve not only the environment but the business bottom line.

The Riverworks Commerce Center building recently received a financial incentive grant of \$42,500 from WE Energies to help pay for a solar electric energy system to be installed on our
